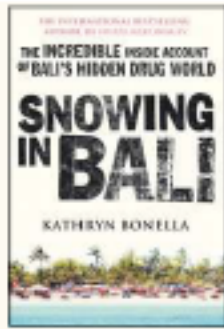


PICK OF THE WEEK

In 1954 Indian prime minister Jawaharlal Nehru called Bali the Morning of the World, and in the 1970s Australian surfers began visiting it in the wake of the classic film *Morning of the Earth*.



Bali has risen to prominence again, partly due to the 2002 and '05 terrorist bombings, and partly because of the Schapelle Corby and the Bali Nine drug busts. But from behind the stories of ill-fated drug-traffickers comes a story of the more profitable cocaine trade. The author interviewed a number of dealers who, almost without exception, never thought they'd be caught.
